Heritage Foundation President Kevin Roberts Vows To "Destroy" Federal Government Through Radical MAGA Project 2025 While He Flirts With Far-Right International Leaders

SUMMARY: Dr. Kevin Roberts has been president of the conservative Heritage Foundation since 2021, where he has prioritized fighting "woke" education, called for aggressive action against "existential problems" like "cultural Marxism," has argued for tearing out same-sex marriage by "root and branch," and spread conspiracy theories about widespread communist infiltration.

Under Roberts, the Heritage Foundation leads <u>Project 2025</u>, a <u>radical MAGA</u> plan to dismantle or defund major aspects of federal government. Roberts has said the project's mission is to "<u>destroy</u>" the administrative state, emphasizing, "<u>Not reform, Not modify, Not tweak. Destroy</u>."

Beyond steering the Heritage Foundation toward the far-right, Robert's own extremism includes:

- Robert's forthcoming book, "<u>Dawn's Early Light: Burning Down Washington to Save America</u>," states that "<u>if a nation is ruled by a uniparty at the top, it must be destroyed and replaced</u>." The book calls for ending institutions like the FBI, the Boy Scouts, and the New York Times.
- Roberts has claimed that Black Lives Matter protests were "<u>far worse than Jan. 6</u>," that the Biden family is "<u>the far bigger threat to our republic</u>," and he answered "<u>No</u>." when asked if he believes Biden won the 2020 election.
- Roberts has regularly platformed and praised extremists on his podcast, including "<u>the right's leading</u> <u>culture warrior</u>" Christopher Rufo—who Roberts called "<u>a great American</u>"—and Big Lie leader Hans Von Spakovsky—the <u>discredited leader</u> of Heritage's election fraud initiative who Roberts said it was a "<u>privilege</u>" to host.
- Roberts said he and Heritage would like to see the Supreme Court "<u>tear out, root and branch</u>," 2015's Obergefell Decision, which <u>struck down</u> state bans on same-sex marriage. When asked if reversing Obergefell meant annulling existing same-sex marriages, Roberts said "<u>I hope so</u>," calling same-sex marriage "<u>a really bad social experiment that we're only beginning to see the rotten fruit</u> <u>of</u>."

While leading Heritage, Roberts has repeatedly shown deep enthusiasm for far-right international leaders, including Hungary's Viktor Orbán and Argentina's Javier Milei:

- Roberts said "<u>I stand in awe</u>" of Hungary's proudly illiberal Prime Minister Viktor Orbán—and called Orbán's far-right regime "<u>the model</u>" for "<u>conservative statecraft</u>." Meanwhile, the Heritage Foundation has faced criticism for being "<u>conquered</u>" by Orbánist Influence, including a "<u>landmark</u>" agreement between Heritage and an Orbán government-backed group.
- Roberts has <u>repeatedly praised</u> Argentina's "<u>anarcho-capitalist</u>" President Javier Milei, who campaigned on <u>radical government cuts</u> and "<u>shock economic reforms</u>." Roberts notably quoted Mielei's claim that "<u>the main leaders of the western world have abandoned the model of freedom for</u> <u>different versions of what we call collectivism</u>."

Prior to leading the Heritage Foundation, Roberts' right-wing career includes:

- <u>2016-2021</u>: While Roberts held multiple top leadership roles in the Texas Public Policy Foundation (TPPF), the right-wing <u>billionaire-founded</u> group "<u>more than doubled in size</u>," opened a <u>Washington</u> <u>D.C. branch</u>, and became a "<u>major force</u>" in the conservative movement with many alumni joining the Trump White House. Notably, TPPF has drawn scrutiny for dodging about \$3 million in taxes on its lavish headquarters by claiming it is a "<u>scientific research organization</u>," citing papers largely written by <u>lobbyists</u>.
- <u>2013-2016</u>: Roberts was president of the <u>very conservative</u> Wyoming Catholic College (WCC), where he <u>refused federal funding</u> for in order to preserve the school's "<u>independence</u>"—which meant <u>blocking LGBTQ</u> students and employees, whom Roberts said "<u>would be contravening church</u> <u>teaching just by being here</u>."
- <u>2006-2013</u>: Roberts <u>founded and led</u> the John Paul the Great Academy, a private Catholic school formerly known as the <u>Pope John Paul II Academy</u>, and Roberts continues to serve as the school's <u>Chair Emeritus</u>. Notably, the school hosted an expensive fundraiser "<u>prominent</u>" QAnon pusher <u>Jim</u> <u>Caviezel</u> in 2024 and Fox News host <u>Bret Baier</u> in 2011, because Roberts said Baier was a "<u>larger net</u>" for fundraising.
- <u>2008-2010</u>: Roberts was <u>founder</u> and <u>executive director</u> for Catholic Families for America, a "<u>grassroots</u>" political group that appears to have also gone by the name <u>Catholic Family Caucus</u>. In 2011, the group was <u>folded into</u> the prominent CatholicVote.org, with Roberts joining the larger group's <u>PAC advisory board</u>. Roberts has continued to enjoy the <u>Leonard Leo-backed</u> CatholicVote.org's vocal praise <u>into 2024</u>.

Remembering our beginnings An excerpt from Dr. Roberts' 2007 Yearbook letter

Let's be honest-founding a school is irrational. Considering myself a rational person, I never intended to found a school... But the Holy Spirit had different plans.

In November 2005, near the end of Holy Mass at our Church in Huntsville, Alabama, my wife Michelle and I listened to our parish's finance committee chairman plead with all of us to invest more of our time and treasure. As we were driving home, Michelle said, "We can definitely increase our tithe to the Church." I said, "Yes, we can. We need to open a Catholic independent school."

The plan was to open Pope John Paul II Academy in 2008. To lay the groundwork, we planned an informational meeting for November 15, 2006. I expected about 25 people to show up– at least until *The Advertiser* decided to run a story about the school, and promote the meeting. Held in the library of the old Holy Rosary Institute, the meeting attracted 99 people. I remember the exact number because we had precisely 99 chairs available for the meeting. Though I knew the meeting went well, I was not prepared for the five parents who actually registered their students for the 2007-2008 school year.
