Michael Anton, Trump's Pick For A Top State Department Position, Espouses White Nationalist and Islamophobic Views And Claimed The U.S. Should Only Accept Immigrants Who Are Deemed Culturally Compatible With White America

SUMMARY: Michael Anton, President-elect Trump's pick for Director of Policy Planning at the Department of State, has a long history of penning conflagratory essays riddled with white nationalism, islamophobia, and conspiracy theories about Democrats' supposed efforts to <u>rig elections</u> and <u>plan military coups</u>.

Most notably, in 2016, Anton penned a <u>6,000-word essay</u> titled "Toward A Sensible, Coherent Trumpism," in which he railed against racial diversity, Islam, and immigration from regions he deemed culturally undesirable to the United States.

- Anton wrote that "Diversity' is not 'our strength'; it's a source of weakness, tension and disunion," and that "the modern conservative believes the leftist lie that his natural affinity for people who look, think and speak like himself is shameful and illegitimate, to be internally repressed and publicly denied."
- Anton railed against U.S. immigration policies using racist stereotypes: "The burden is forced on Americans to prove that Muhammed is a terrorist or Jose is a criminal, and if we can't, we must let them in."
- Anton wrote that "Islam is not a 'religion of peace," but "a militant faith that exalts conversion by the sword and inspires thousands to acts of terror—and millions more to support and sympathize with terror."
- Anton: "Not all Muslims are terrorists, blah, blah, blah, etc. Even so, what good has Muslim immigration done for the United States and the American people?"

Anton's public writing track record includes his infamous <u>"The Flight 93 Election" piece</u>, an essay that compared a possible Hillary Clinton presidential victory in 2016 with the terrorist plane hijackings on September 11, 2001. It also includes pieces in which he <u>called</u> Joe Biden's victory in 2020 a "steal," <u>alleged</u> that Democrats and military officials—supposedly including a group funded by George Soros—were scheming to depose Donald Trump if Biden lost in 2020, and <u>peddled</u> conspiracy theories about Democrats rigging elections.
